KEY VOCABULARY

Totem — A natural object or animal that is believed to be spiritual Totem Pole - A pole on which totems are hung or carved on to. Teepee - A portable tent made of skins, cloth or canvas on a frame of poles Tribe - a group of people, including many families or generations Dream Catcher - A handcrafted item used in Native American tradition to separate good and bad forces Regions - A group of places that have something in common Latitude - The distance measured in degrees North or South of the Equator Longitude — The distance measured in degrees East or West of an imaginary line from The North to The South Pole Equator — An imaginary that divides the Earth in to the Northern and Southern Hemisphere. Hemisphere - half of a sphere or ball, often used to describe the two halves of the Farth Irrigate — To bring water for crops from somewhere else <u>Culture</u> — The beliefs, customs and way of life for a group of people. <u>Climate</u>—The weather an area has over a long period of time Environment - Your surroundings that include climate, land and plant life.
