

<ul> <li>Watch a Numberblocks clip each day at: BBC or <u>CBeebies</u>. Use this guide <u>here</u> to give you ideas on what to do with your children whilst watching an episode.</li> <li>Access <u>EducationCity</u> (<i>Click on:</i> <i>'Subjects' - 'Mathematics' - 'EYFS' - 'F1' or 'F2' - Activities</i>). Focus on counting, finding one more/one less and addition activities.</li> <li>Log in details can be found in your child's red contact book.</li> <li>Practise counting up to 20. This can be done through playing hide and seek, singing number songs, chanting, board games etc.</li> <li>Practise recognising and ordering numbers to 20. This can be done through the use of number flashcards. You could create your own using pens and paper, or access them online <u>here</u>.</li> <li>Play this counting <u>game</u>. Count how many of each animal you can see. Practise Sing Number songs to practice counting, reciting numbers in order, one more, one less using number songs: Five Little Ducks, Five Little Men, Ten Green Bottles.</li> <li>Our number of the week is 4. What do you know about the numeral 4 anywhere?</li> <li>Can you count out 4 objects?</li> <li>Can you think of an addition or subtraction number sentence for 4?</li> <li>Discuss with a grown up, or record your response using flipgrid! Click here.</li> <li>Complete some of the shape challenges here. Sign up for free, using the help code UKTWINKLHELPS.</li> <li>Play ShapeMonsters. Can you name each 2D shape before you sort it?</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Continue to share a variety of books at home. Favourites can be repeated. Hearing the patterns of language in a story will support your child's language development. Discuss the characters and events with your child, to ensure they are understanding what is being read to them what they are reading.</li> <li>Read The Very Hungry Caterpillar, or access here on YouTube. Have a go at completing one of the story activities here.</li> <li>Children to read their reading book to an adult daily. Visit Oxford Owl for free eBooks that link to your child's book band. You can create a free account. Complete the linked Play activities for each book.</li> <li>With your child, look in magazines, newspapers and books for the tricky words they are currently learning. They could use a highlighter to highlight in magazines and newspapers. (Our red (tricky) words are: 1, to, the, no, go, he, she, my, of, said).</li> </ul>

Please see the separate sheet below, which details the sounds we have covered in our different phonics groups. Access PhonicsPlay and sign up for free, for interactive phonics games (phases 2- 4). Access EducationCity (Click on: 'Subjects' - 'English' - 'EYFS' - 'F1' or 'F2' - Activities). Log in details can be found in your child's red contact book. Play the animal sound matching game here. Sing the song, 'Old McDonald Had a Farm'. Instead of saying the name of the animal, make the sound. Can your child figure out which animal it is? Create a selection of word flashcards for your child to read. Ask your child to sound out and blend each word, then draw a picture of the word they have just read. - Big and small animals- Draw as many big animals as you can on one piece of paper and as many small animals as you can on another sheet of paper. Some children may be able to write a list as an alternative.
- Find all of the animal books in your house- Ask your child to look through the books in your house and to find any with animals on the front cover. Ask them to sort the books into groups of their choice e.g. animals that can fly, swim, big, small, live on a farm/ at the zoo.
