Please spend 20 minutes on SOUND CHECK. Play on <u>Hit the Button</u> - focus on number bonds, halves, doubles and times tables. Year 3 times tables are focusing on the 3x, 6x, 4x and 8x tables. Make sure you are confident with the 2x, 5x and 10x first. Adding totals of the weekly shopping list or some work around money. This game could help you to add up money. If you are unsure, have a notepad and pencil/pen next to you for space to work out your answers. Alternatively, you could access money games on <u>Education City</u> . Practise telling the time. This could be done through this game (scroll down to access the game). Read to the quarter hour and the nearest 5 minutes. Get a piece of paper and create your own multiplications questions. This could include pictures, diagrams, explanations, methods etc. You can be as creative as you want to be. Please see your learning journal for the Newark Hill written methods for long addition and subtraction. Practise adding and subtracting fractions. You can create your own fractions by slicing up pizza or cutting up cake.	<ul> <li>You could share a story with another person. This could be a chapter book where you read and discuss a chapter a day.</li> <li>Read to an adult and then discuss what you have read. Read with expression and intonation.</li> <li>Watch Newsround and discuss what is happening in the wider world.</li> <li>Read a story on Flipgrid. (You can access this through TEAMS) Read it, act it out, perform it, describe it, explore it or share your illustrations of it.</li> <li>Explore new vocabulary you find when reading. What are the origins of this word? Can it be modified? Can you find any synonyms or antonyms for your new word? Share on Flipgrid.</li> <li>With and adult, look in magazines, newspapers and books for new vocabulary you are unfamiliar with. You could use a highlighter to highlight in magazines and newspapers.</li> <li>Go on to Education City. We are working on pronouns, suffixes and prefixes.</li> <li>Practise your inference skills. How are the characters in your chosen story feeling? Why do you think the author chose to write in the way that they have? # Let's Wonder:

- Draw a picture of yourself and label their drawing with the qualities you have.
- How do others see you differently? Ask people at home to add to their qualities.
- How are you different to other children in different parts of the world? What makes you similar to other children around the world?

## Let's Create:

 Complete an observational drawing of what you see outside a window in your house. Then get out into the garden and find natural forms such as stones, leaves, flowers and animals. Complete sketches, showing an awareness of different viewpoints of the same object. Remember to concentrate on tone and shading.

## Be Active:

 Move around your home and garden taking photographs from different viewpoints. Which photos do you like? Do the people you live with like the same photos as you? Why? Why not?



• Recommendation at least 2 hours of exercise a week.

#### Time to Talk:

 Talk about keeping safe, discuss different ways to keep safe.
 Basic hygiene rules, road safety, internet safety, water safety, being safe around the home, stranger danger. How do different people view this?

### Understanding Others and Appreciating Differences:

 Listen to different pieces of music from around the world, which styles of music do they prefer and why?
 <u>Music</u> Maybe you could learn a song by heart and perform it. You could record this on <u>Flipgrid.</u>

## Reflect:

 Design your own ideal world. Would your world contain the same things as other people? Which things are most important to you? What are you going to include?
