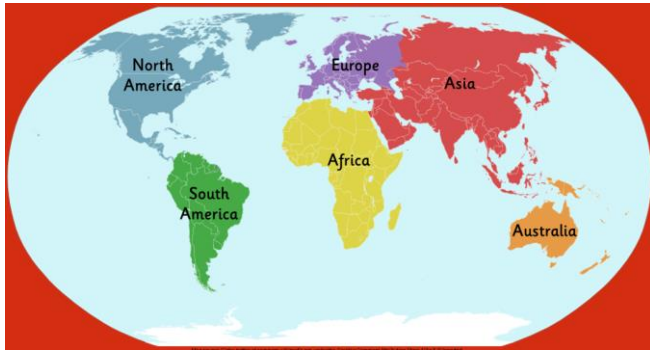


The Americas

- North America is the 3rd largest continent.
- The population of North America was recorded at just over 579 million in 2016.
- The average age expectancy of a North American is 79 years.



South America

- South America is the 4th biggest continent
- The population of South America was recorded at over 423 million in 2016.
- The average life expectancy of a South American is 75 years

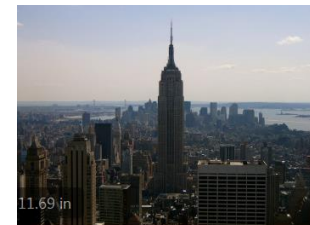
Landmarks

- The Andes** – The world's longest mountain range. Located on the islands of Aruba, Bonaire and Curacao in the Caribbean Sea, off the coast of Venezuela
- Angel Falls** – Located in Venezuela. It is nearly 1000m high.
- Estadio de Maracana** – An open air stadium in Rio de Janeiro. It is the location of the FIFA 2014 World Cup
- Cristo Redentor** – A statue of Jesus Christ in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.



Landmarks

- Niagara Falls** – The collective name for 3 waterfalls located on the border between Canada and United States
- The Statue of Liberty** – A tall sculpture found on Liberty Island
- The White House** – The residence of the President of the United States
- The Empire State Building** – A skyscraper in New York.








Electricity

- ⦿ **Electricity** - a form of energy that is carried through wires and used to operate machines, lights, etc.
- ⦿ **Mains electricity** - supplied to a building through wires.
- ⦿ **Plug** - a device for making an electrical connection between an appliance and the mains.
- ⦿ **Electrical circuit** - is a path in which electrons from a voltage or current flow
- ⦿ **Circuits** - a diagram of an electrical component.
- ⦿ **Conductor** - a material that conducts or transmits energy.
- ⦿ **Insulator** - a material that is a poor conductor of energy.

Native America Facts

- ⦿ The Native Americans are the indigenous peoples and cultures of the United States.
- ⦿ Sometimes these peoples are referred to as Indians or American Indians.
- ⦿ Different tribes and cultures lived in different areas.
- ⦿ The Native Americans were grouped into tribes or nations usually based on the area they lived in and their culture such as their religion, customs, and language.
- ⦿ Many of the tribes are well known such as the Cherokee, Apache, and the Navajo.
- ⦿ Today, some of the descendants of the original American Indians live on reservations. These are areas of land set aside specifically for Native Americans.

Vocabulary

Longitude	The distance measured in degrees East or West of an imaginary line from The North to The South Pole
Latitude	The distance measured in degrees North or South of the Equator
Equator	An imaginary that divides the Earth in to the Northern and Southern Hemisphere.
Climate	The weather an area has over a long period of time
Human feature	Something that is man-made for example a building or monument
Physical Feature	A natural landmark such as river or mountain
