- **The Andes** The world's longest mountain range. Located on the islands of Aruba, Bonaire and Curacao in the Carribean Sea, off the coast of Venezuela
- Angel Falls Located in Venezuela. It is nearly 1000m high.
- Estadio de Maracana An open air stadium in Rio de Janeiro. It is the location of the FIFA 2014 World Cup
- Cristo Redentor A statue of Jesus Christ in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.

- The Native Americans are the indigenous peoples and cultures of the United States.
- Sometimes these peoples are referred to as Indians or American Indians.
- Different tribes and cultures lived in different areas.
- The Native Americans were grouped into tribes or nations usually based on the area they lived in and their culture such as their religion, customs, and language.
- Many of the tribes are well known such as the Cherokee, Apache, and the Navajo.
- Today, some of the descendants of the original American Indians live on reservations. These are areas of land set aside specifically for Native Americans.
