Key Vocabulary:

Habitat	The natural place something lives
Microhabitat	A very small habitat in places like under a rock, leaves or a branch.
Depend	Many living things in a habitat depend on each other. They need each other for different things.
Survive	To stay alive.
Minibeast	A small creature like an insect, worm or spider.
Conservation	The protection of things found in nature.
Woodland	Areas with lots of trees that grow close together.
Urban	Areas with lots of buildings for people to live and work in.
Coastal	Areas where the land meets the sea.
Arctic	An extremely cold habitat at the very top of the Earth.

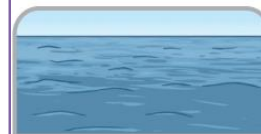

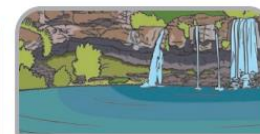
