
All living things reproduce and have offspring.

Some animals give birth to **live young**. Their offspring normally look like them when they are born.


Other animals have offspring which do not look like them, e.g. fish and amphibians. Some animals lay eggs which hatch into live young. This **young** then develops into an **adult**.


When these eggs hatch, some animals look like their adult, e.g. birds and reptiles.
