Rules with the Academy Dog 1. Ignore Margot - speak to the handler first 2. Ask permission to approach 3. Four paws on the floor 4. Take turns 5. No barking 6. Let sleeping dogs lie 7. No throwing of sticks or other objects 8. If she gets over excited she needs to have some time out This slide is shared with pupils in assembly. Pupils will be reminded of what is appropriate behaviour around dogs. Pupils will be told not to put their face near the dog and will always approach it standing up. Children will be told never to go near or disturb the dog while it is sleeping or eating. Pupils must not be allowed to play too roughly with the dog. Any interactions will be supervised, handled and managed by one of the trained handlers only. This provides consistency and increases confidence, whilst reducing risk.	Low
