Uplevelling Sentences



Six dogs pulled the sledge.

First, create expanded noun phrases.




Use **adjectives** and **modifying nouns** to add extra information about the nouns in your sentence.

Six <u>brave</u>, <u>muscular</u> dogs pulled the <u>rickety</u>, <u>wooden</u> sledge.

Next, add a fronted adverbial.

Fronted adverbials are words or phrases at the beginning of a sentence which are used to describe the action that follows.





Finally, add a subordinating conjunction.

Subordinating conjunctions are the first words within a subordinate clause. Subordinate clauses do not make sense on their own but when they are used with a main clause, they create a complex (multi-clause) sentence.

Across the perilous ice, six brave, muscular dogs pulled the rickety, wooden sledge until they reached the cabin.
